#### **A vision for the Downs**

We believe we live in a very special area and see this project as an opportunity to take action at a landscape scale to make it even an even better place for wildlife, local communities and visitors. We will focus on two strategic aims:

Aim 1: To improve the condition and connectivity of the ecological network of the Marlborough Downs

Aim 2: To connect people to the landscape of the Marlborough Downs

### B. Excerpt from Marlborough Downs Articles of Association:

**The liability of the members is limited to a sum not exceeding £10**, being the amount that each member undertakes to contribute to the assets of the charity in the event of it being wound up while he, she or it is a member or within one year after he, she or it ceases to be a member, for:

- (1) Payment of the charity's debts and liabilities incurred before he, she or it ceases to be a member;
- (2) Payment of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up; and
- (3) Adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves.
