



What is a pollinator?

MAKE A BEE DRINKING BATH!

Bees and other flying insects need access to fresh water that they can't fall into and drown. Fill a shallow dish with some pebbles and/or shells and some water, making sure that it's not too deep. Then look out for bees enjoying a drink.



Pollinators drink nectar from flowers and feed off pollen. Then they transport the pollen grains as they travel from place to place. Lot's of insects and small animals pollinate many crops that we eat, such as tomatoes, peas and apples, they also help our wild plants throughout the countryside.








What is a Bee Road?
