Comments on format:

- Great venue a little early for plant identification
- Talks were a bit long but very good speakers!
- Perhaps have a presentation from a member of another group
- It was fine given that the weather was excellent. A fall-back position in case of heavy rain/storms might be a reasonable plan depending on space available/where it might be held.
- Advise forum members to record their questions for the question session. I thought of some and then couldn't remember them for the panel.
- No it was a great mix.
- Instead of Q & A, have another perspective from another Farmer Group re their experience.
- The field trip (grassland and dew pond) was interesting and great to see what had been achieved but to my mind light on information I could take home and use.

- Cost plus travel might have put people off. Important to have the hall/room on site so field trip follows smoothly
- probably about right for the cost, although I couldn't stay for lunch. It would save on organisational input if people brought own lunch, but then it's nicer for people to communicate in the lunch queue maybe?

- I enjoyed it. Met interesting people and brought home a few interesting facts for the groups I am involved in. I am glad I went and will promote it positively. It was spoilt by small but important things. Introduce the speakers! I don't know who Richard is or how he is involved. Who is Chris! At least Jemma was introduced and told us who she was. A hot drink on arrival would have been easy to provide (I have travelled for over 2 hrs). Nothing to drink (no I don't mean alcohol) during lunch not even water on offer! Every conference I have been to offers a hot drink during the breaks keeping the urn on and topped up should be standard.

#### Response from MDNEP

Thank you to all who contributed on the day, and for such comprehensive feedback which will be very useful for whichever group takes up the challenge to host the next forum. I have provided a breakdown of costs on page 5 and have the following additional responses to some of the comments:

- First, a <u>very big</u> apology that the urn somehow got switched off and so hot drinks weren't available during the mid-morning break or at lunchtime but maybe someone could have found me and let me know? However, tea/coffee was available on arrival and after the field trips, and water was on tap.
- A map and postcode were included on the booking page online and it was stressed in the confirmation email to work out your route beforehand as there's no phone reception on the Downs.
- As far as I'm aware, all the speakers were introduced but apologies if not enough information was given about their involvement in the Space for Nature project.
- We were very lucky with the sunshine, but of course there was a wet weather option.
